## **More Than Grit**


Winner of the American Christian Fiction Writers

## **The Gilded Newport Series**

## **Lemon Icebox Pie Recipe**

A clause in our wedding vows includes my ability to make lemon icebox pie from Marvin's mother's recipe. No kidding. At first I rebelled, then realized that it's actually easy peasy. Here's the old Willis family recipe:

2 cans Eagle Brand condensed milk (don't use low-fat or it won't set properly)
